Scholarship Proposal

NAME OF FUND: Sigma Rho Alumni Association, Beta Chapter, Scholarship

SPONSOR: Sigma Rho Alumni Association of Beta Chapter, Incorporated.

AMOUNT: A gift to the University of Minnesota through the Greater University Fund of \$3,560.68 in support of undergraduate scholarships as defined below.

PURPOSE: Sigma Rho Alumni Association of Beta Chapter, Inc. voted to establish this scholarship fund to provide financial assistance to needy and qualified undergraduates in the School of Mines and Metallurgy or to needy and qualified high school graduates who wish to enroll in said school.

Both principal and interest, if any, may be expended for scholarships as defined herein.

The amount of individual awards shall be determined by the scholarship committee.

ADMINISTRATION: This scholarship fund will be administered by the Bureau of Student Loans and Scholarships in accordance with established policy and practice governing administration of student aid funds.

Evaluation of the qualifications of candidates and the selection of recipients of scholarship awards shall be the responsibility of a special committee comprised of at least the following members.

1. Dean, School of Mines and Metallurgy - who shall serve as chairman.
2. Three members of the faculty of the School of Mines and Metallurgy to be appointed by the chairman.
3. Director, Bureau of Student Loans and Scholarships - who shall serve as executive secretary.

SELECTION CRITERIA: Criteria which shall serve the scholarship committee in determining recipients of scholarship awards shall include:

Selection Criteria
continued :

1. Academic Aptitude: Recipients shall be chosen on the basis of relative scholastic achievement of special promise and aptitude in the work of the School of Mines and Metallurgy.
2. Vocational Promise: Recipients shall possess above-average potentialities for success in their chosen field of work as indicated by past record, test data and other supplemental information.
3. Character: Recipients shall be of good character and have a record of good citizenship.
4. Financial Need: Recipients shall be those whose educational opportunities will be bettered by receiving financial aid under these scholarships.
